#### Halloween & Grief

Halloween can be a fun time for children, teens and adults alike. Many people love to dress up in costumes, go to parties, and trick-or-treat for candy. Seasonal decorations ranging from colorful fall leaves to jack-o-lanterns to spooky scenes are popular and done in good fun. But this time of year can be very difficult for some, especially the newly bereaved.

Families have told us they feel bombarded at Halloween by the constant images of death:



headstones, skeletons in caskets, and gory corpses. Some children and teens can become overwhelmed by the scary sights and sounds, especially if they are still learning the difference between reality and make-believe. For grieving children, teens and families, Halloween can be a painful trigger for the loss they have experienced.

If you are a parent or caregiver of a child or teen in grief, invite a conversation about this. Kids may be carrying fears or worries that they do not openly share. Being available to listen and support kids is one of the best things you can do for them!



#### Virtual Grief Support Groups for Parents or Guardians of Children & Teens RESUME

Ele's Place Ann Arbor offers ongoing peer support groups Monday through Thursday evenings, two weeks per month for grieving children and teens ages 3-18 via Zoom, at no cost to families.

This week, our grief support groups for the parents or guardians of Ele's Place Ann Arbor children and teens RESUMED! We are grateful to be able to support adults in their grief so they can be more present with their

child's/teen's grief. The adult groups are facilitated by Licensed Clinicians via Zoom.
